In the quiet dignity of the Lord Provost's Room at the City Chambers in Edinburgh, Wilf Salisbury had conferred on him the Fellowship of the Rubber Industry. It was fitting that his certificate should be presented officially by the first citizen of Edinburgh, where Mr and Mrs Salisbury have resided for almost 25 years.

The occasion, on 23rd November, though informal, was given due ceremony by Lord Provost Herbert Brechin, who as a professional man has been similarly honoured by the Institute of Surveyors. That he contributed considerable importance to this honour to Uniroyal and Edinburgh was evident when our group were his guests for close on an hour. In welcoming Mr Salisbury he revealed that he is the only Lord Provost of Edinburgh to have welcomed the Board of Directors of Uniroyal, Inc. That was when they visited Edinburgh in June 1966, just a few weeks after the Lord Provost started his three years of high office.
